## 2012 OCEANSIDE VILLAGE PASSES

In the packet you received with this newsletter you will find all the forms needed to fill out to apply for your car, golf cart, family and frequent visitor passes. Please take a minute and look these forms over. Filling out the forms properly will expedite the process.

Homeowners may fill out the forms and send them in by mail anytime after receiving the packet or they can be dropped off at the Ocean-side Village office and the passes will be mailed to you, or, if you choose, you may pick them up at the OSV office. Please send a note with your packet if you would like us to hold your passes at the office; otherwise, we will mail them to you. However, passes will not be ready for distribution until the week of January 16, 2012. 2011 passes will be void after February 28, 2012. **A reminder to all homeowners: In order to receive your passes, you must be up-to-date on all lease and amenities and any other fees you may owe the Village.**

For any homeowner not on direct draft your 2012 lease and amenities payment book is enclosed in the



packet as well. For any homeowner on direct draft, you may call the office at (843) 650-4440 for your new rates. For people who use online bill paying be sure to change your amounts in January.

## FITNESS CENTER RENEWALS

On January 2, 2012, homeowners will be able to renew their fitness center memberships. The renewal cost for homeowners is \$20.00 per person and we ask that the homeowners bring in their ID badges and entry cards.

You will be able to renew your memberships Monday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

If you decide not to renew your membership to the fitness center we ask that you return your entry card to the OSV office so that we may assign the card to someone else in an effort to cut down costs.

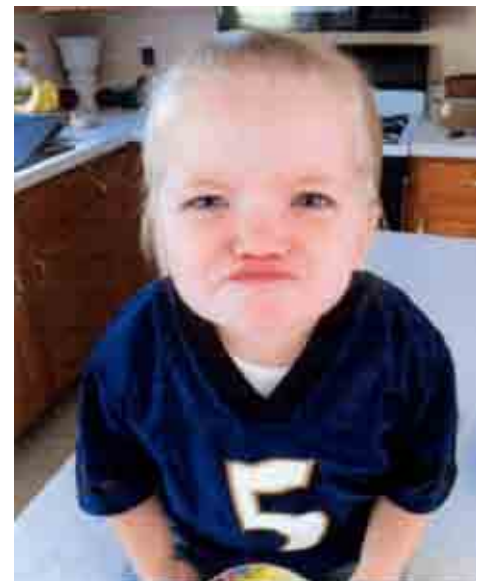
Karli is currently attending the University of Georgia and is pursuing a double major in Broadcast Journalism and Spanish.

Our course (Tupelo Bay Golf in Garden City) welcomes walkers throughout the year. In fact, about 35% of the rounds on our Executive Course are played by walkers who enjoy both the nature and golf experiences. Walkers are always welcome.



Golf courses located along the Strand offer almost unlimited beauty both in natural vistas as well as a great collection of wildlife who call this home. A walking round of golf at Tupelo provides 3.5 hours of golf time with increased proximity to the small wonders of nature even if your shots are not up to "par". Sand and water abound. Birds and various small animals are everywhere and walkers recant encounters with amazing "raccoon like" ground squirrels who befriend them as they walk along. Cart riders miss much of the personal contact with these "friends" who are often times afraid of carts.

Walking a scenic 3280 yards is a stimulating way to get some exercise while taking in the surroundings. Taking the "golf walk" in the natural beauty that is a golf course can help lift both the heart rate and the soul.
